I. Introduction.

- A. The world is in the midst of a great financial crisis.
- B. God's infallible and all-sufficient Word speaks to our financial issues.

- C. We got into this mess by violating biblical principles people think they are smarter than God. Prov. 26:12 16:18 Gal. 6:7
 - 1. Businesses and investors have tried to circumvent God's way of earning wealth by trying to get rich quick through using debt to finance speculative investing.
 - 2. Individuals have used debt to finance lavish lifestyles.
 - 3. Governments, recognizing that spending is popular but taxation is not, have created trillions of dollars of debt.
 - 4. Governments has encouraged banks to lend money to people who could not afford to repay (subprime loans) which led to housing bubble.
 - 5. The government has made us surety for the bad debts of others (Fannie Mae etc.).
 - 6. People are not being held accountable for their actions. Ps. 37:21 Pr. 3:27f Ga. 6:7
 - 7. Much of our lost prosperity was founded on folly. Pr. 13:11a

D. Our approach.

- 1. We will survey what the Bible teaches about finances –general principles, getting money, spending money, borrowing money, and saving for the future.
- 2. It is important to distinguish between:
 - a. Biblical precepts, the violation of which is sin.
 - b. Principles of wisdom the violation of which is folly.
 - c. Particular ways one may choose to apply precepts and principles (when there may be other valid techniques).
- 3. We will seek to knock down many of the money myths of our day.
- 4. We will seek to provide practical steps and tools by which you can help your family, or counsel others, through troubled times.
- 5. We will use some case studies as examples.
- 6. We will point you to other useful resources: Dave Ramsay, Crown Ministries, etc.

II. General principles about money.

A. Money myths.

- 1. Money is evil.

B. What is wealth?

- 3. Money is worth only what someone else is willing to give you for it.
- 4. The value of any form of wealth can change (i.e. inflation).
